



## **Project Stream Presentation and Public Trek on MHC Campus Sunday, September 22, 2019**

The South Hadley Bike-Walk Committee invites the public on a trek on the Mount Holyoke Campus to walk through the boardwalk section of [Project Stream, including its newly completed sections, and explore the Upper Lake trails on the campus](#). Project Stream, a real-life restoration project, is at the heart of the Restoration Ecology Program at MHC.

The approximately 90-minute trek is about 2 miles in length and consists of leaf-lined and dirt paths with only a few minor-moderate ascents and descents. [The Project Stream boardwalk is ADA-accessible and meanders through forested wetlands alongside the stream. The public can choose to participate in only the Project Stream portion of the trek event.](#)
